RE: *Alcorn Avenue – Petition for Changes to Permit Parking*

Dear Ms. Antoniou,

Attn: Bob Bonner, Permit Parking Supervisor, District One

Please find attached a petition from residents of Alcorn Avenue requesting an investigation of the permit parking system on their street. The petition represents 42 households on Alcorn Avenue. I am requesting that you report on the residents' proposals #1, #3, and #4. For attention to the residents' proposal #2, I will request that the Police Parking Enforcement attend Alcorn Avenue regularly.

The residents request that the permit parking hours be changed to 6:00 p.m. to 10 a.m., Monday to Friday, with one (1) hour parking at all other times. Would you please report separately on the feasibility of this proposal (#1) to the next Community Council.

In addition, the residents request that the over-allocation of parking permits for Alcorn Avenue be "rolled-back" (proposal #3) from 110% to 100% allocation as soon as possible. Further to a meeting with the main petitioner, Mr. _____, I request that this removal of the over-allocation be achieved via attrition.

The petitioning residents' proposal #4 requests that the permit parking policy for the City of Toronto be changed to ensure specific allocation of one on-street parking permit per household without off-street parking facilities. Also, the residents request that the permits that have been issued to households with off-street parking facilities be recalled to make possible this redistribution of parking permits to households that do not have off-street parking. Would you please report on the feasibility of proposal #4 with specific attention to Alcorn Avenue.

Also, please find attached an email from the main petitioner on Alcorn Avenue, Mr. _____, which includes information on five households who have off-street parking facilities. Assuming that the permit was accurately allocated, these "priority 2" or "priority 3" permits were not

included in the data given to my office from the Permit Parking office with their recent investigation reports (September 2003, *please see attached*). Would you please investigate this situation and formally report on the status of all permits on Alcorn Avenue with respect to priorities of permits allocated.

Thank you for your cooperation and I look forward to working with you and the residents of Alcorn Avenue to resolve this issue.
